

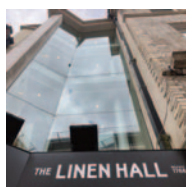
Public Activities on the Day of Reflection 21st June 2024

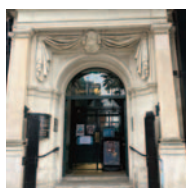
Items from the Corrymeela Community Archive will be on display in a cabinet on the 4th floor of the Linen Hall Library.

A 'thought tree' will be in place and attendees will be invited to share their hopes for the future by adding a leaf, with a personal message, to the tree. A number of support organisations will also be in attendance.
